NOTICE OF CONTRACT AWARD

**Statewide – Coventry Health Care of Florida, Inc. d/b/a

Any party who is substantially affected by FHKC's intended decision to award a contract must file a written notice of intent to protest with FHKC within seventy-two (72) hours after the posting of the notice of intent to award, excluding weekends and state holidays. A substantially affected party is any party who submitted a proposal or response for the services that are at issue in the protest.

The substantially affected party must file a formal written protest within five (5) business days after the date of the notice of intent to protest is filed.

Failure of a vendor to timely file a notice of intent to protest and formal written protest shall constitute a waiver of proceedings and waiver of any rights to contest FHKC's intended decision.
